

HOLYHEAD LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS No 6/2009

NAVIGATIONAL REGULATIONS

Speed Limits.

Inner Harbour	Minimum speed
New Harbour	12 Knots
New Harbour (West)	8 Knots
Approaching Marina and Moorings	Dead Slow

Vessels not to be made fast to Navigation Buoys:

No vessel to be made fast or lie to any buoys or beacons marking the channels or shoals of the Harbour.

Inner Harbour:

No vessel shall, except with permission, enter or leave the Inner Harbour.

Precautionary Area, TSS:

A Precautionary Area is established within the inbound and outbound lanes at the entrance to the Harbour. Small vessels should not impede the progress of large vessels that are required to use the inbound and outbound lanes.

Events, boat races, regattas etc,

The organizer of any race, regatta or marine event should give at least 7 days notice in writing to the Harbourmaster for approval.

Organizers will be expected to produce a satisfactory risk assessment covering the marine safety aspects of the event.

Obstruction to fairways and berths:

Anchoring, and the laying down of, buoys, tackle, nets or pots is not permitted within the fairways, or near to berths, piers, harbour walls, dolphins, moorings or navigational buoys.

Obstructions are liable to be removed without notice.

Collisions, groundings, injuries and sinkings:

The above and damage to navigational buoys or beacons are to be reported immediately to the Harbourmaster

Moorings

No mooring, buoy or tackle, for the purpose of establishing a mooring, shall be laid down, within the Harbour, without written consent of the Harbourmaster.

Anchoring

Anchoring is not permitted in the Outer harbour or New Harbour without permission. Anchoring is subject to the payment of Harbour Dues.
